Standard Chartered donates visual assistive equipment to visually impaired students

Bandar Seri Begawan, 10 March 2016 – Standard Chartered Bank held a donation handover presentation to more than 19 visually impaired students at the Special Education Unit (UPK) headquarters in Gadong yesterday morning. Standard Chartered donated more than BND10,000 worth of visual assistive equipment to the students who were identified through the Special Education Unit, providing them with equal opportunity for learning in mainstream schools.

Presenting the items to the students was Rino Donosepoetro, CEO of Standard Chartered Bank who said:

"For many years now, since 2003, Standard Chartered Bank has been passionate about our cause against avoidable, preventable or treatable, blindness and have been active around many initiatives locally and globally to tackle this under our Seeing is Believing programme."

Standard Chartered worked with V-Care Optical to donate glasses with specially fitted lenses for low visual impaired students. The bank also donated Perkins Braillers for blind students which will help them towards producing Braille written exercises; talking dictionary and an office copier to UPK. During the handover event, guests were also given a tour of the facilities for visually impaired students as well as shown how various equipment at the centre is used to assist them with their studies and daily lives.

Seeing is Believing is the Bank's global initiative to tackle avoidable blindness and visual impairment. It is a collaboration with International Agency for Prevention of Blindness (IAPB) and leading eye care organisations. It raises funds for investment in eye care projects that aim to have long-term impact in areas of high need. Standard Chartered has committed to raising USD 100mn by 2020 for the programme through fundraising and Bank investment.

In Brunei, Standard Chartered continues to demonstrate its commitment to the visually impaired community by working closely with the Special Education Unit, Eye Clinic and the Brunei Darussalam National Association of the Blind on various initiatives.
