...delivers eye care services to Kotu Preparatory School...

Standard Chartered, in partnership with the Sheikh Zayed Eye Unit, has provided eye care services to pupils of the Kotu Preparatory School in a demonstration of its commitment to preventable blindness and visual impairment in the Gambia.

The activity, which focused on lower primary children, was to help address potential eyesight challenges among the children and take measures to treat them.

The Bank's eye care initiative, "Seeing is Believing" is a global community campaign, established in 2003, to celebrate the Bank's 150th anniversary. It is driven by staff who fundraise, volunteer and raise awareness on avoidable blindness issues across the globe.

Since 2003, the Bank has reached almost 1000 people through the campaign to tackle avoidable blindness. In 2011, a total of **GMD514K** was contributed to the Sheikh Zayed Regional Eye Care Centre under the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare to cater for 400 cataract operations for women and children nationwide under this initiative.
