Staff of Standard Chartered Bank visit Mildmay

Kampala, Saturday 29 October 2011 – Staff of Standard Chartered Bank have spent the entire morning at Mildmay. They donated an assortment of household items and played games with the children. The initiative was accomplished under the Employee Volunteering scheme of the Bank where staff out of their own volition come up with and using their own resources sponsor initiatives that will make communities better.

The assortment of items which included clothes, blankets, bed-sheets, pampers, sanitary towels, washing soap, detergents, toys, books and toilet paper worth UGS 3m were officially handed over by Lamin Manjang, the Standard Chartered Bank's Managing Director, on behalf of over 50 staff who were present. Staff of Standard Chartered also played a number of indoor and outdoor games with the children.

Speaking at the function, Lamin Manjang stated that in addition to the work done by the Bank in the communities where it operates, staff continuously mobilize themselves and raise funds out of their incomes to help those in need under the Employee Volunteering Scheme. Lamin announced that in addition to the efforts of the staff, Standard Chartered Bank was going to make a contribution of UGS 5.5m to Mildmay. He also made a personal pledge and contribution to take care of 5 children and mobilize other members of staff to take on other children as well.

The Mildmay Centre, Uganda opened in 1998 and has steadily developed over the years. Currently it is Mildmay International's (Mildmay International is based in the UK) largest project in terms of number of people this programme reaches. It offers care to more than 21,000 men, women and children living with HIV. This centre-based approach to care is truly holistic with a wide variety of health services also available on-site – including psychiatry, dentistry, opticians, tuberculosis care, physiotherapy, as well as cancer



screening and a vaccination programme for girls aged nine to 13 to prevent the Human Papilloma Virus associated with cervical cancer. Mildmay also delivers care and treatment from many outreach clinics, enabling them to take their specialist care to rural and remote communities.

Over the last 18 months, staff of Standard Chartered Bank have engaged in more than 25 such initiatives aimed at making communities lead better lives. Standard Chartered is Here for good.
