Standard Chartered Trophy - Road to Anfield 2014 kicked start in Vietnam

A once-in-a-lifetime chance to score a goal at Anfield's Kop end

1 March 2014, Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam – Standard Chartered Bank Vietnam today launched the “Standard Chartered Trophy - Road to Anfield 2014” football tournament in Vietnam.

Vietnam’s representatives at the Standard Chartered Trophy will also receive a professional training session from Liverpool Legends and coaches prior to playing in the finals.
