Second Lady joins StanChart's 'P.L.A.N.T. Campaign'

7th JUNE 2014 – Lusaka, ZAMBIA: Standard Chartered Bank CEO, Andrew Okai, and the Second Lady, Dr. Charlotte Scott commemorated World Environment Day by planting 100 trees at the Bauleni School for Children with Special Needs. The commemoration is part of Standard Chartered Bank's <u>P.L.A.N.T. Campaign</u> - <u>People Loving And Nurturing Trees</u>, which was launched on 5th June 2014.

Speaking at the tree-planting event at Balueni School for Special Needs, Dr. Charlotte Scott said, "I would like to commend Standard Chartered Bank for recognizing the country's environmental challenge and for taking strategic efforts to support Bauleni School for Special Needs over the years. I am encouraged that Standard Chartered Bank staff have come out to volunteer here today and I urge the Bank to continue this commendable effort."

Dr. Charlotte Scott and Mr. Okai also took the opportunity to unveil a plaque at the school library, which was built by Standard Chartered Bank.
