Standard Chartered Arts in the Park *Mardi Gras* 2009

40,000 visitors celebrating the world-class Mardi Gras with 8 giant puppets and 500 youths at Victoria Park

[Hong Kong - 15th November, 2009] Organized by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation and sponsored by Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited, "Standard Chartered Arts in the Park Mardi Gras 2009" came to its finale today attracting over 40,000 visitors in Victoria Park over the weekend for the fun of community arts. Inspired by a variety of celebrations from around the world, the 2-day event was decorated with festive installations including a 21-feet-tall 3D giant birthday cake sculpture, 500 pieces of hand-dyed silk flags and 8 mega puppets up to 15-feet, including the Magician, Elephant, Tree Fairy, Sun God, Eye of Horus, Japanese Princess, Giraffe and Birthday Cake.

The highlight of the event was the large thematic parade held this afternoon where 500 youths wore their hand-made dramatic costumes and accessories together with 8 giant puppets in a Mardi Gras, bringing the event to its finale.

Ms. Florence Hui, Under Secretary for Home Affairs Bureau, Mr. James Tien, Chairman of Hong Kong Tourism Board, Dr. Allan Zeman, Committee Member of the Board of the West Kowloon Cultural District Authority, Mr. Ben Hung, Executive Director and CEO of Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited, Mrs. Bethy Tam, Chief Operating Officer, Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited and Ms. Lindsey McAlister, Founder and Artistic Director of Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation officiated at the ceremony. Together they unwrapped a gift box filled with colorful balloons to show their support in promoting youth arts development in Hong Kong. The parade kicked off when Mr. Ben Hung put a diamond on the forehead of the







Elephant, the leading giant puppet of the parade which consists of over 500 youths wearing hand-made dramatic costumes and accessories.

Following its tremendous success last year, Standard Chartered Arts in the Park Mardi Gras was extended into a 2-day fiesta this year. Mr. Ben Hung, Executive Director and CEO of Standard Chartered Hong Kong, said, "Standard Chartered is proud to have grown together with Hong Kong for the past 150 years, and is committed to contribute to the community that we operate in. By joining hands with the Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation, together with the support of the general public, we hope to develop Standard Chartered Arts in the Park into the next biggest community event in Hong Kong alongside the Standard Chartered Hong Kong Marathon."

From Aug to Oct 2009, 500 students from 97 secondary and primary schools had been working with local artists to create a variety of dramatic costumes, headdresses, choreographed dance routines and giant puppets, which were inspired by a variety of celebrations from around the world. At the two-day event in Victoria Park, 500 silk flags made by more than 2,000 students from 45 local schools, together with 8 mega puppets of 12 - 15 feet produced by students and renowned artists were showcased as big art installations at the venue. Throughout the event, more than 60 youth groups performed on stage, while 15 art stalls and dance and movement workshops were opened free-of-charge, allowing the public to enjoy and experience the fun of the visual and performing arts while enjoying the festive atmosphere.
